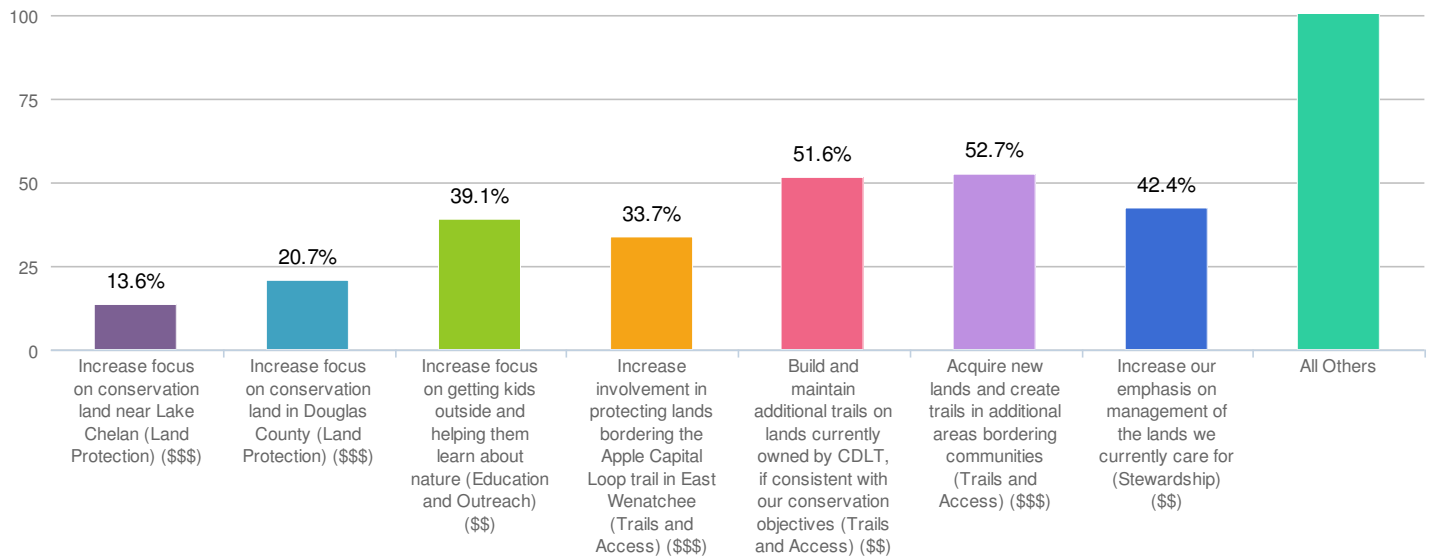

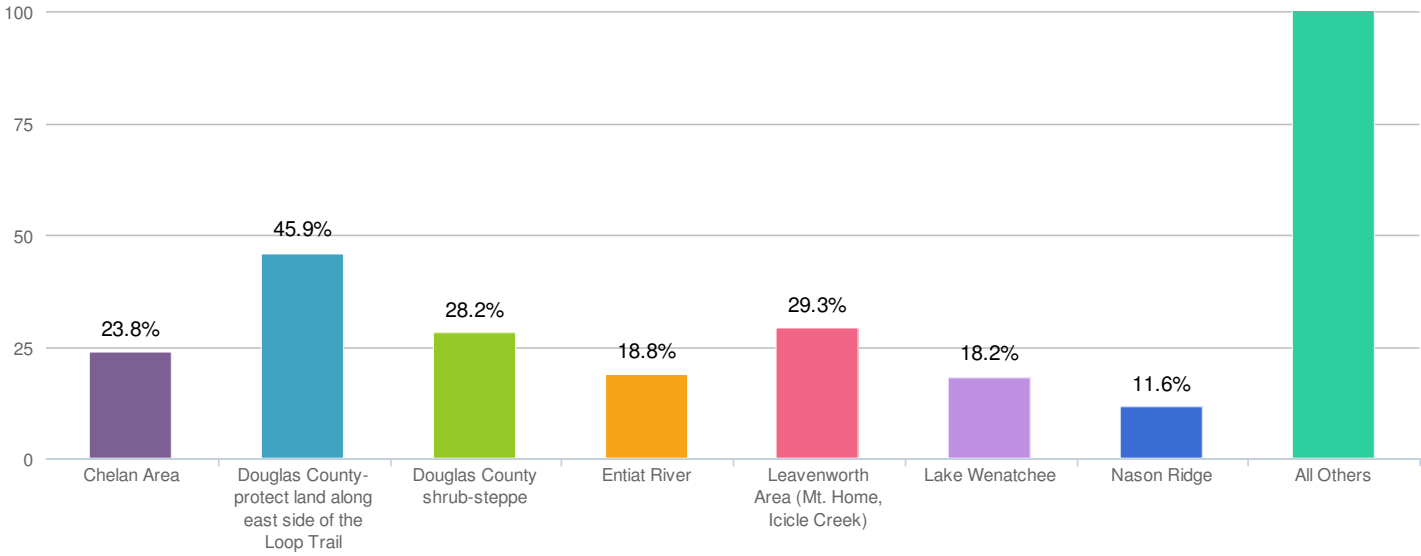

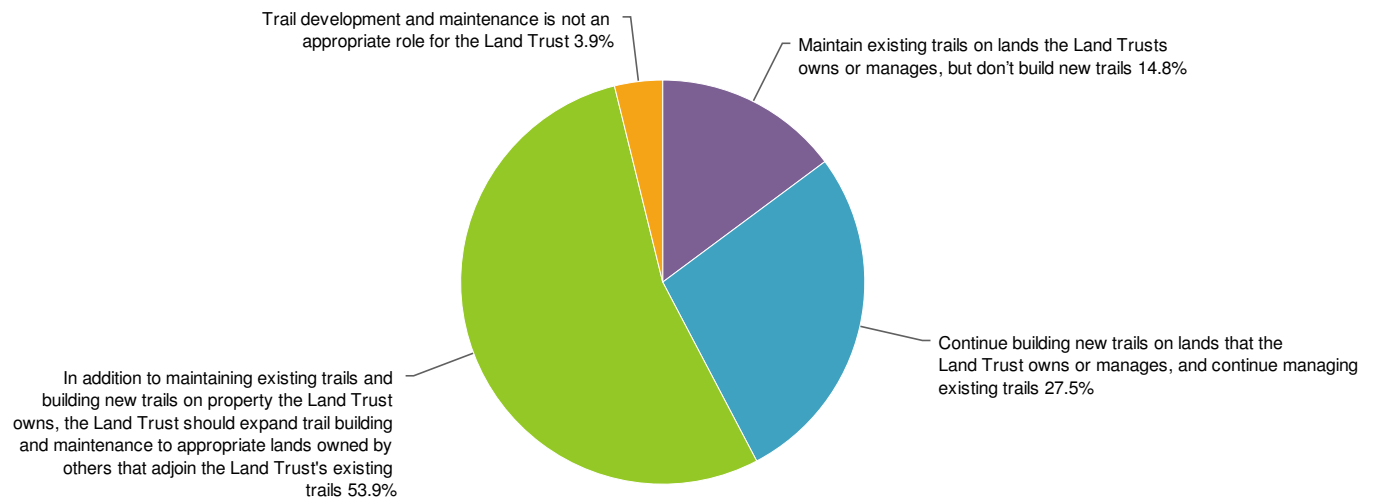

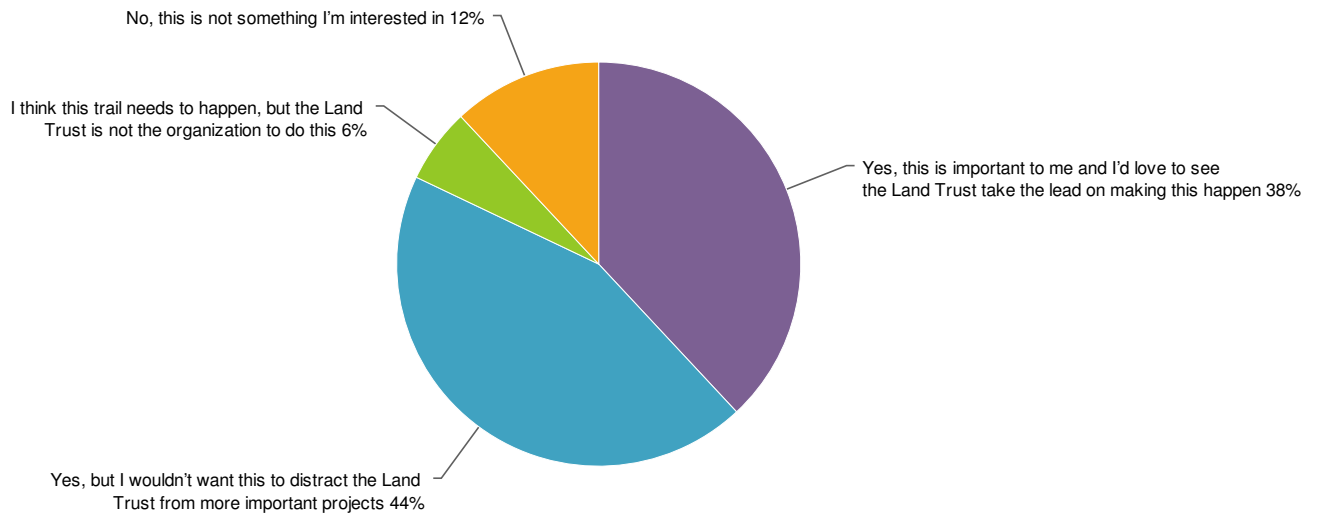

5. What do you see as the best role for Chelan-Douglas Land Trust related to establishing and managing trails for public access? Choose one.



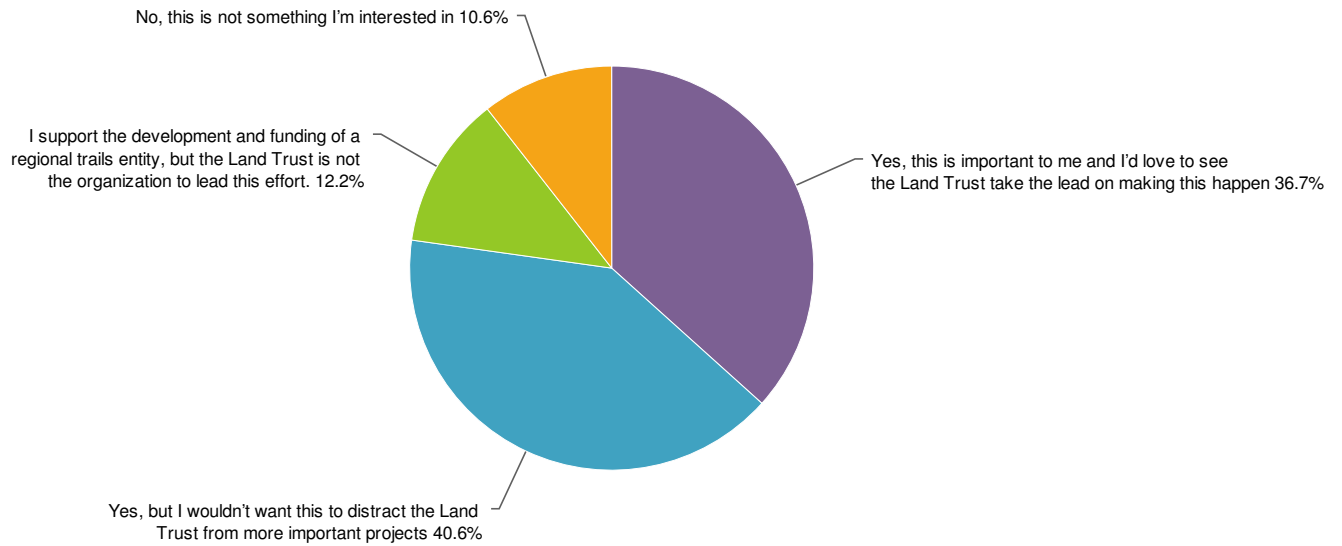

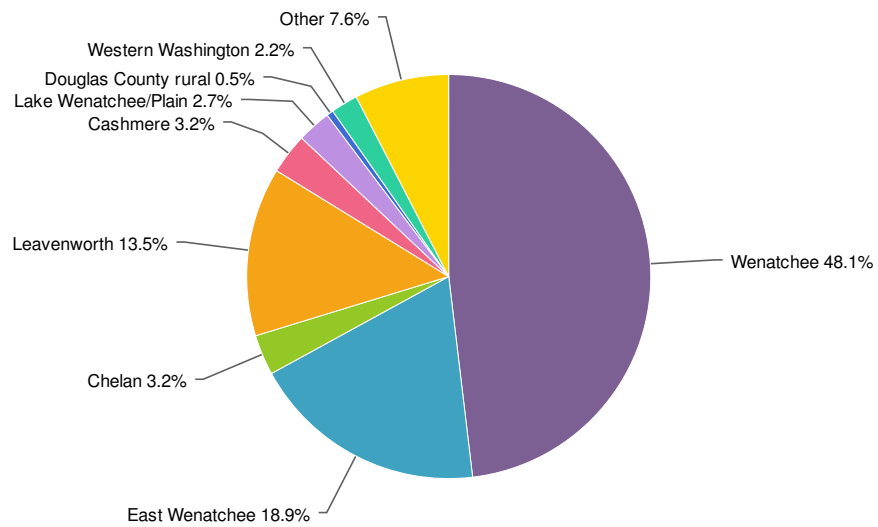

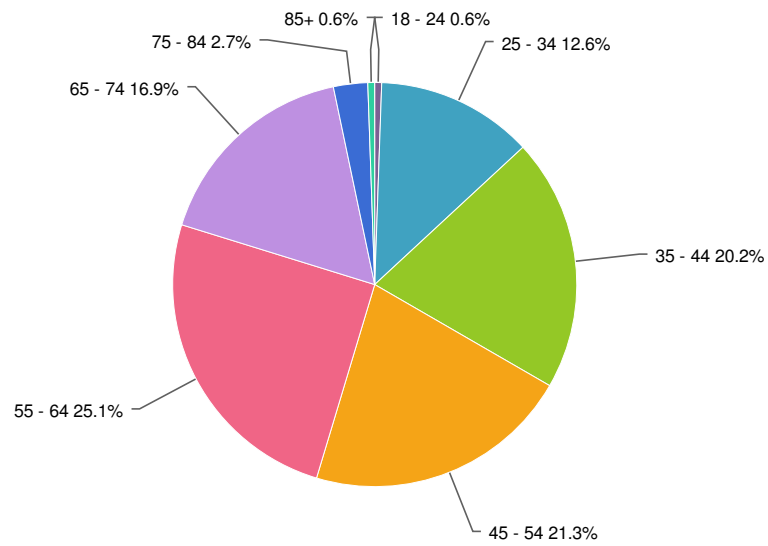
